Charles Fleschner reports that a special joint meeting of the Humboldt North Coast Land Trust and the Museum Society was held at the HSU Marine Lab on the evening of July 17th. Dr. Robert Rasmussen and Dr. Milton Boyd described and presented work done in the last quarter by their classes in marine biology. The class assignment had been to do a research project on intertidal life forms and present it in the form of an exhibit that would convey the information to other people. Dr. Rasmussen stated that it was the most exciting class he ever taught. The enthusiasm and creativity of the students produced a remarkable assortment of informative posters and story boards and one slide show with taped narration. Bill and Loretta Marshall had given the group some information early in the quarter on how to design an effective exhibit. The material produced by the class is in the custody of the Trinidad Museum Society, and will be displayed in our new building in the near future.



Katie Boyle reports that the Museum booth at the Blackberry Festival, with photographs, membership material, buttons and postcards attracted many visitors and took in \$28.00.

Axel Lindgren is working on plans to construct a traditional Indian canoe for the Museum. The Arcata Redwood Company offered to provide a giant redwood log, eighteen feet long and four feet wide. The log will be placed on Glenn Saunders' lot facing Main Street near Ocean, and the carving will be done there by expert craftsmen under Axel's supervision.

We want to express our appreciation to all these people who are doing so much to help our dream come to life - a large and hearty "Thank you!" to the hard working volunteers who put in so much time and labor on the building , and to Ray and Kay Davis and Mickey and Patti Fleschner for their generous financial contributions. After the insulation is finished the electrical work can be completed and we will be able to hold meetings in our new center.

The September 8th meeting will hopefully be held at the Museum Center which will be a cause for celebration indeed!
