HOUSE TOUR
TO BENEFIT MUSEUM SOCIETY

HOUSE TOUR April 16, Sunday afternoon will feature three houses, two in Trinidad on Edwards Street and one off North Bank Road on Hunt Drive.

Tickets and map will be available from 12:45 at the Museum Center on Trinity Street. Houses will be open from 1 to 4. Refreshments will be available at the Museum Center.

On Historic Day, tickets will be available at the Museum Booth or at the Museum Center. Cost for members (couple) will be \$2., and for non-members \$5.

The two homes for viewing on Edwards Street have full views of Trinidad Bay and the Ocean and Sea Lion rocks to the west. One home has a sunken living room with a 23 foot redwood cathedral ceiling. A bridge from the upstairs studio and master bedroom crosses over the dining and living room to a flying balcony, viewing the harbor and ocean. The redwood siding has been allowed to age naturally to vary its coloration to soften its presence in the environment. An older home on Edwards has many practical storage areas which will be labeled to aid those do-it-yourselfers get ideas. It also includes hobbies of photography, knots and fancy ropework display, machine embroidery, and a woodworking workshop.

The third home has a spectacular view of Humboldt Bay, the Ocean to the west, and is in a lovely rural hilltop setting. It is very unusual. Planned and owner finished, it even includes some hand built furniture.

Homes will be open from one to four. Please show your ticket at the doors. Do not leave your ticket at the house.

The North Coast Redwood Interpretive Association Newsletter Winter 1989 had the following plans from Superintendent William Beat's column.

1. The completion of the Traditional Yurok Village at Patrick's Point S.P. is scheduled for the Fall of 1989 after over thirty years of waiting. We have also been successful in getting the new Patrick's Point Visitor Center back on the Department's multiple year Capital Outlay Program. We will be working with NCRIA to develop a strategy for getting this new facility funded in a timely manner.
2. We are continuing to look for ways to find a new permanent home for the Northern Counties Logging Museum. After reviewing the various alternatives, it appears that a site near Trinidad offers the best potential for developing a museum facility. Park staff will complete Initial Investigations on this location during 1989 with hopes of getting it into the acquisition program.

MUSHROOM EXHIBIT

An active member of the Trinidad Museum Society has generously offered to fund the development of an exhibit of mushrooms of the Greater Trinidad Area, complete with appropriate exhibit cases. The project is being supervised by Dr. David Largent, Professor of Mycology at Humboldt State University. The collection, preservation, and exhibit will be done by three of Dr. Largent's students.

Preservation methods will include the relatively new "wax impregnation technique" which permanently preserves the mushrooms in a durable condition. It is planned that the project will be completed in about a year. More later.
